Any student enrolled in grades 9 through 12 in a public, private or parochial, cyber school or who is home schooled in Pennsylvania is eligible to participate.

Students MUST prepare essays without assistance and provide a statement to that effect on the last page. (See winning essay's sample)

All essays <u>MUST</u> have a COVER PAGE containing the following:

- The Essay Title (As stated above WITH NO CHANGES),
- Student's Name, address, telephone, & email address (if applicable),
- School Name and Address if applicable,
- Teacher's verification of Student's Grade Level,
- Sponsoring American Legion Post Number & address.
- Parent or guardian's name, address and phone number,
- > Student's signature.

ALL essays (typewritten preferred but not required) MUST be no less than 500 words and no more than 1,000 words.

The title MUST appear on <u>all pages</u> of the essay as well as the cover page.

Essays shall be judged on the following:

- > Proper English structure.
- Accuracy.
- > Extent of information.
- Originality Any material not original must be cited in a bibliography for the information of the judges, stating publication, volume, page, date, publisher and author. Anything cited from the internet must include a verifiable internet address such as: http://palegion.com/about/our-history/
- No reference shall be made, for or against, any political candidate or political party affiliation.

DEADLINE DATES:

- 1. BEFORE JANUARY 9, 2024 STUDENTS must submit their Essays to
 a LOCAL AMERICAN LEGION POST.
 Each high school may select one (1)
 winner for each American Legion Post
 in their school district. To locate a post

 Directory).
- BEFORE FEBRUARY 27, 2024 DISTRICTS shall have forwarded their winning essays to their <u>SECTIONAL</u> <u>Essay Vice Chairperson</u>.
- BEFORE MARCH 13, 2024 each SECTION (East, Central, West) shall have selected and forwarded their winning essay to the Department Essay Chairperson.
- The Department of Pennsylvania's Essay Program's top three winners will have been judged and selected by MARCH 27, 2024.

The Department of Pennsylvania will award the following prizes to those top three (3) winning Essays.

- First Place Winner will be awarded a \$3,500, a plaque and a trip to the PA American Legion Convention in July to read the winning essay to the assembled delegates.
- The Second Place Winner will receive \$3,000 and a plaque.
- The Third Place Winner will receive \$2,500 and a plaque.

- 3. The title must appear on all pages of the essay, as well as the cover page.
- 4. ALL essays must be no less than 500 words and no more than 1,000 words.
- 5. Typewritten essays are preferred but not required
- 6. Essays shall be judged on the following:
 - > Proper English structure
 - > Accuracy
 - Extent of information
 - Originality Any material not original must be cited in a bibliography for the information of the judges, stating publication, volume, page, date, publisher, and author.
- 7. Students must certify that essays are prepared without any assistance other than that provided for all members of their class. Lack of the certification will result in a disqualification.
- 8. The school may determine its own winner(s) and submit the winning essay(s) to the sponsoring American Legion Post(s) for judging no later than February 5, 2024. The local post shall determine when the contest will be held and types of awards to be presented
- The Pennsylvania American Legion Essay Program, as any program conducted by The American Legion, is designed to provide balanced judging. It is suggested that at least three (3) qualified judges be used.
